PROTECTING TEMPORARY WORKERS



Host employers and temporary workers both have a responsibility to ensure a safe and healthy workplace. These guidelines will help make sure that workers are protected, no matter how long they are at a site.

TEMPORARY WORKERS CHECKLIST

- Mow what tasks they are approved to perform and how new tasks will be added. It should be clear what hazardous tasks, equipment, and machinery they should never engage with.
- Able to recognize site- and taskspecific hazards at the worksite and understand the best ways to reduce and/or eliminate them.
- Have access to PPE and know how to properly use it.

- ✓ Have rights and responsibilities under OSHA law.
- ☑ Know how to access first-aid treatment and what to do in case of an emergency.
- Aware of how to report workrelated injuries, illnesses, and close-calls.
- Can participate in safety and health programs, including safety meetings/committees, toolbox talks, scheduled trainings, and hazard-specific programs.

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
