RIDING STEP

Using the riding step can be convenient, but there are strict rules about when you can do so. Be aware of these rules to ensure you use the riding step safely and only when appropriate. Remember, it is always safer to ride in the truck cab.



- **NEVER RIDE ON THE STEP WHEN THE TRUCK IS BACKING!**
- Only ride on the step when it is moving forward at 10 MPH or slower and travelling less than 1/5th of a mile.
- You must ride holding on with both hands and facing the truck.
- Only ride on the riding step, not the entry step to the cab or the back of the truck.
- Do not lean out and away from the truck.
- Never jump off or on a moving truck. It must be at a complete stop every time.
- Regularly inspect the step and the handles as well as your gloves and shoes for substances that might make cause slipping.
